CALLING ALL OAKLAND TOWNSHIP BARN OWNERS AND ENTHUSIASTS

EXCITED TO HAVE A QUILT ON YOUR BARN? JOIN US!

We invite you to participate with us to create a Township-wide Quilt Trail! It would be great to have as many barn-owner participants as possible. Visible locations for the quilts would be beneficial so drivers on the trail can see your quilt from the roadside. Design your own quilt square or enlist members of OTHS for help with design ideas. Your quilt square can be a temporary or permanent fixture. Squares are usually made from two 4'x8' sheets of plywood or smaller depending on your location, visibility, design, and available barn surface area. Once the Barn Quilts are installed, a *Barn Quilt Trail Brochure* will be produced to showcase them. The Barn Quilt Trail will be publicized locally and a self-guided tour will be offered in 2016. And we want YOU to be a part of our Quilt Trail!

The Quilt Trail will include Cranberry Lake Farm Historic District's quilt square. Designed by Mary Asmus in 2014 to celebrate OTHS' 40th anniversary. It features four branches representing the collaboration of OTHS, Parks and Recreation Commission, Historic District Commission, and Oakland Township to protect the natural beauty of the lake, the park and the farmstead.

YOU SHOP - OTHS WINS!

FROM THE PAST - THE GARLING FARM

We are sad to report the loss of yet another piece of our township's pioneer history - the homestead of John and Catherine Rodenbough at 2220 West Clarkston Road near Lake George Road, known by many as the Garling Farm. A fire in the wood burner somehow spread and sadly was too far advanced for firefighters to control, leading to the house's demolition.



Demolition exposed the sturdy framework of large mortise and tenon beams that were hand made by John Rodenbough (d 1861) in the early 1840's. This farm and nearby land had been in the Rodenbough family from 1838 to 1883. A brief history shows that John Rodenbough initially bought 80 acres from the Governor on April 20, 1838 and added 20 acres across the

road. By Before his death in 1856, his son William had purchased 140 acres across the road. The land and farm passed down to brothers Archibald (d 1884) and Christopher (d 1886). William's farm faced his father's but there are no signs of this farm left.

Later the farm built by John was owned by Harry Garling, whose wife Ethel was descended from Betsey Ross.

This was a great loss since it was a complete farm which included a windmill and was known as "Best View Farm". If you might have additional information about the Rodenbough family to share, please contact Sue Fox at othsmember@comcast.net.
